

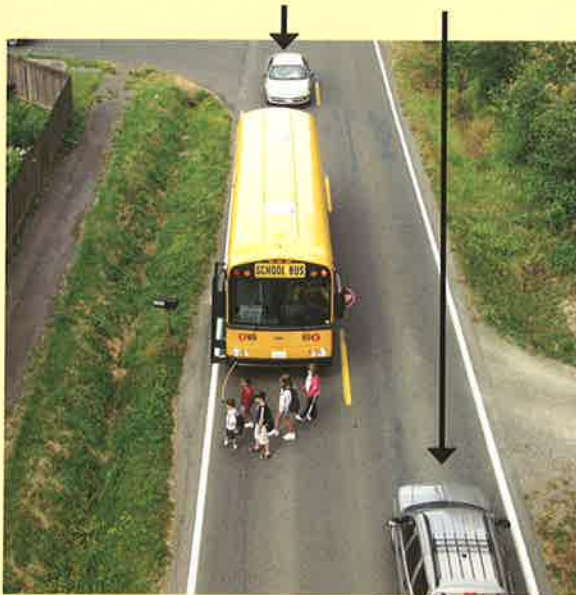
You must stop for the bus when the stop paddle is out and the lights are flashing if:

- ① You are traveling either direction on a two lane road.

- ② You are traveling the same direction as the bus and you are on a road with more than two lanes of traffic.

- ③ You are traveling the same direction as the bus on a road with a two-way turn lane.

Fact:

- While an average of 800 children die and 152,000 children are injured each year during school travel times, school bus collisions account for only 2 percent of those deaths and 4 percent of injuries.

Fact:

- Travel to and from school in passenger vehicles account for 75 percent of the deaths and 84 percent of the injuries.

Fact:

- Laws requiring cars to stop and wait while the school bus loads and unloads children are one reason the school bus remains the safest way to get to school.

Flashing lights and stop paddle mean "STOP!"



Fact:

- Stop paddle violation fine (\$300+) cannot be waived, reduced, or suspended.
- Fifty percent of the money collected goes into the school zone safety account which funds enforcement, engineering, and educational programs designed to improve school zone safety and pupil transportation.
