Safety and Civility in Schools - 3205

VISION

Students and staff should learn and work in schools that are free from violence, intimidation, threats, harassment and fear. Wise, consistent enforcement of the rules and ethical decision-making by both youth and adults will achieve a school environment, which is attractive to students and creates the most favorable conditions in which to learn.

STRUCTURE

1. Building Level: Creating and Maintaining An Orderly Environment for Learning

Each school community is unique to the adults and students who work and study in it. Therefore, each school shall develop a plan to promote safety and civility for all.

2. District Level: Providing Leadership and Support for Orderly Schools

The Superintendent shall review and approve the schools' plan and shall develop a long-range plan for the District to support those plans.

ACCOUNTABILITY (MONITORING FOR RESULTS)

An information system shall be developed to enable each school and the District to assess progress toward their safety and civility goals.

COMMUNITY ADVOCACY

Schools shall involve students, staff and parents in the development of their plans to promote safety and civility.
